## Notes:

Students in the teacher certification program should see both their academic major advisor and their education advisor every semester. The education advisor is responsible for the requirements of the teacher certification program only. All major and University graduation requirements should be addressed with the academic major advisor.

The internship occurs in two phases that are consecutive. Students should complete the application for internship on TK20 during the spring semester prior to starting Phase I. In Phase I, fall only, students are enrolled in 411 and 429 and spend at least two half days per week at their assigned placement school. In Phase II, spring only, students register for 456 & 457 and start their full-time internship in early January, following the schedule of their assigned school. No other courses should be taken during the semester of the full-time internship.
