Qualifying scores on Praxis I, Praxis CORE, SAT, or ACT are required for admission. Students must maintain a 2.75 GPA for program admission and continuous enrollment. Students must maintain a 3.0 GPA to enter and remain in Phase I and Phase II of internship Internship Phases I and II must be completed in consecutive semesters. All coursework must be completed prior to entering Phase II. An extra fee for Phase II of internship is collected with that semester's tuition.
