





Code of Ethics
Preamble The National Education Association believes that the education profession consists of one education workforce serving the needs of all students and that the term \Box educator \Box includes education support professionals.
The educator, believing in the worth and dignity of each human being, recognizes the supreme importance of the pursuit of truth, devotion to excellence, and the nurture of the democratic principles. Essential to these goals is the protection of freedom to learn and to teach and the guarantee of equal educational opportunity for all. The educator accepts the responsibility to adhere to the highest ethical standards.
The educator recognizes the magnitude of the responsibility inherent in the teaching process. The desire for the respect and confidence of one's colleagues, of students, of parents, and of the members of the community provides the incentive to attain and maintain the highest possible degree of ethical conduct.
The Code of Ethics of the Education Profession indicates the aspiration of all educators and provides standards by which to judge conduct. The remedies specified by the NEA and/or its affiliates for the violation of any provision of this Code shall be exclusive and no such provision shall be enforceable in any form other than the one specifically designated by the NEA or its affiliates.

he education profession is vested by the public with a trust and responsibility requiring the highest ideals of professional service. In the belief that the quality of the services of the hall exert every effort to raise professional standards, to promote a climate that encourages the exercise of professional judgment, to achieve conditions that attract persons wort rofession by unqualified persons.

n fulfillment of the obligation to the profession, the educator:

- . Shall not in an application for a professional position deliberately make a false statement or fail to disclose a material fact related to competency and qualifications.
- . Shall not misrepresent his/her professional qualifications.
- . Shall not assist any entry into the profession of a person known to be unqualified in respect to character, education, or other relevant attribute.
- . Shall not knowingly make a false statement concerning the qualifications of a candidate for a professional position.
- . Shall not assist a non-educator in the unauthorized practice of teaching
- . Shall not disclose information about colleagues obtained in the course of professional service unless disclosure serves a compelling professional purpose or is required by law.
- . Shall not knowingly make false or malicious statements about a colleague.
- . Shall not accept any gratuity, gift, or favor that might impair or appear to influence professional decisions or action.
