Pedagogical competencies of instructors play a crucial role in improving the quality of the teaching and learning in higher education institutions. However, in many countries worldwide, pedagogical training is not a requirement for being an instructor at a university. This talk explores how pedagogical competencies of instructors affect student perceptions by focusing on three key dimensions of classroom pedagogy: delivery, communication, and measurement and assessment. Specific emphasis will be placed on "classroom communication" and how it relates to concepts beyond the classroom setting.
