

Summary of Alumni Feedback Survey

The UMBC Education Department Alumni Survey is administered using a web-based survey instrument. The Department invites participation from recent alumni of the teacher preparation program. Respondents are asked to provide feedback regarding how well the program prepared them to enter the field of education about a year post graduation. The survey asks alumni to assess the program on a scale of 1-4 (1=Not Effective, 2=Somewhat Effective, 3=Effective, 4=Very Effective) with four representing the highest level of proficiency. The items on the survey are listed below with the mean scores for each item. The data set displayed in the table below reflects 10 responses.
